They also need to commit themselves to listening to, and learning from young people to continuously working to make the programme more relevant, exciting, accessible and learner-led to girls today. And to role model empowering leadership that puts young people at the centre of their own learning. To make this possible, we need to support our unit leaders to learn innovative ideas and approaches, lead their teams to be more girl-centred, and inspire the young people they work with to reach their fullest potential and take action to change the world.

- Discover new programme ideas that respond to the interests of girls today
- Build strong networks to exchange best practices and inspiration after the conference

- Workshops on the Girl Guide and Girl Scout educational method

# **Participants**

Each Member Organisation can send six adult leaders to *Learn, Lead, Inspire*, and place up to three additional adult leaders on a waiting list, in case further places are available.

#### Criteria

- 1) Where possible, one delegate should be a member of the national team responsible for the development of the national educational programme
- 2) All other delegates should be unit/group leaders who are actively working with girl members aged 19 or below. Of these, none should have attended a previous WAGGGS event and at least half the delegates should be young women aged 30 and below

WAGGGS is very conscious that only a small number of unit leaders in the Asia Pacific Region can benefit directly from this opportunity. To have an impact of the quality of the Girl Guide and Girl Scout experience in Asia Pacific Region, the learnings from the conference need to reach all our unit leaders! Therefore, we strongly recommend that:

- a) <u>Before</u> attending the conference, delegations agree with their Association a clear plan for how to share the learnings both with the national team and with a wider pool of unit leaders in the Association
- b) The Association follows the conference on social media, and promotes the conference's social media channels to its members in advance and during the event, to encourage virtual engagement.

# **Dates**

*Learn, Lead, Inspire* will be held from 27 November to 2 December 2017 Participants are expected to arrive latest on the morning of 27 November, ready to participate in the opening session at 7.00pm. Participants can depart from the morning of 3<sup>rd</sup> December.

### Language

The conference will be held in English. No interpretation service is available. Associations that wish to supply their own interpreter may request one additional place at the event.

Participation fee: US\$ 650 per person

### **Financial Assistance**

Member Organisations requiring financial assistance for young women aged 30 years and below to attend the conference are required to indicate this intention when registering. Grant allocations will be decided after participant registration.

## **Cancellation Policy**

Please be aware that fees are non-refundable. If you do not turn up to the workshop, your fees will be forfeited and not returned to you. However the transfer of the paid fees to a substitute participant is possible. In the case that the fees are not paid to Girl Scouts of the Philippines before the event and with a guarantee of payment upon arrival by the Member Organisation, the respective Member Organisation will be held responsible to bear costs of the participant as stated in the registration form, should the participant not show up at the event
